Presentations/student demonstration observations	Students will prepare an expert clinical presentation outside clinical and present during clinical post conference.	In and Out of Class
Other	Clinical judgement packets. Students will obtain, analyze, and synthesis client data during clinical rotation. Creation of a written clinical packet may take place outside of clinical.	In and Out of Class
Guided/unguided journals	Students will reflect on clinical performance during and after clinical rotation. Students may create a written reflection after clinical experience.	Out of Class Only
